DULIN CHURCH TRANSITION PHASE 5 (updated)

1. COVID VARIANT RESPONSE

- Dulin Church will use the COVID ACT NOW (<u>www.covidactnow.org</u>)
 parameters of low, medium and high in Arlington and Fairfax
 Counties to determine in-person worship and on-site program
 ministries. This uses a broad array of data points to determine level
 of community risk.
 - + Low level- wear a mask based on your personal preference.
 - + Medium level, as recommended, will allow for optional masking.
 - + High level, as recommended, will require masks for all persons.
- These levels will be monitored to give Dulin disciples notice of when level of community risk changes.

2. HYGIENE

- Encourage persons to be intentional in maintaining proper hygiene during all gatherings.
- Sanctuary and rooms cleaned and sanitized before and after by staff.
- Hand sanitizer stations located at entry points of building.
- Restrooms cleaned before and after by staff.
- Signage

3. PHYSICAL DISTANCING

- Optional social distancing. The pews near the organ in the sanctuary will be available for persons who wish to practice social distancing of 3 feet.
- Food and drink allowed inside and outside building.

4. MASKS

- Form fitting masks, preferably N95, KN95 will be worn when recommended or required.
- Choir masking based on community risk level.

5. VACCINATION

- As a matter of covenant, we commit to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 before attending church events and activities in person.
- We follow the CDC definition for what it means to be fully vaccinated. People are considered fully vaccinated for COVID-19: two weeks or more after they have received the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna or other vaccine authorized by the World Health Organization), or two weeks or more after they have received a single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson [J&J]/Janssen) and they have received a COVID-19 vaccine booster dose as soon as eligible per CDC recommendations.

6. SCREENING

- Stay home if not well.
- Health Acknowledgement Posters will be posted throughout the building.
 Vaccination policy will be specified on the Health Acknowledgement Poster.

7. LIMIT EXPOSURE

Meetings, events, and worship will be limited to 90 minutes

8. <u>VENTILATION</u>

- 20-ton hvac system in large gathering spaces.
- Constant replenishing of air
- Front doors/windows will be opened, weather permitting.

9. WORSHIP and MINISTRY EVENTS

All ministries are encouraged to provide both in-person and virtual participation.

- a. One Sunday morning worship service at 10 a.m.
- b. WELCOME HOME worship service, Sunday, September 11, 10 a.m.
- c. Sunday School for children and youth is suspended and replaced with monthly programs and activities for children, youth, and families on Sunday afternoons and evenings.
 - i.e. September- Welcome Back

October- Trunk or Treat
November- food drive
December- Living Nativity
January- Smithsonian Museum event
Adult Sunday School will meet in preference to class members.

- d. ESL will offer in-person classes for 10 weeks, Tuesday and Thursday, 10 a.m.-noon. We have teacher commitments for four classes.

 Unvaccinated students will be required to wear a mask.
- e. Ministry of Hope will offer a once-a-month on the 2nd Sunday of the month, 8 a.m. outside carry-out breakfast with \$10 gift card beginning October. A job description for each volunteer will be created including masking and gloves. This team is writing up the proposal based on Falls Church Presbyterians' experience with monthly take out dinners.
- f. The Dulin Preschool has its own protocol which is optional masking.
- g. Hands-on outreach activities off site of Dulin Church will follow host's COVID protocol.
- h. Nursery will be provided for children ages 2-5. Nursery workers will be required to mask due to close contact with children. Parents will be texted to come to the nursery for intimate care issues. A nursery care procedures manual is being updated.

10. STAFF

- All staff, including nursery workers, will be fully vaccinated with a proof of vaccination card maintained in the church office.
- We follow the CDC definition for what it means to be fully vaccinated. People are considered fully vaccinated for COVID-19: two weeks or more after they have received the second dose in a 2-dose series (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna or other vaccine authorized by the World Health Organization), or two weeks or more after they have received a single-dose vaccine (Johnson and Johnson [J&J]/Janssen) and they have received a COVID-19 vaccine booster dose as soon as eligible per CDC recommendations.

11. POSITIVE CASES AT DULIN CHURCH

Should any staff/pastor/guest/ disciple, vendor test positive for COVID 19, that person shall notify the church office and pastor immediately. If staff, the person shall self-quarantine a minimum of 5 days after the positive test. The staff person may return to work by wearing a mask at all times for at least the next five days.
